A BILL OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY SENATE TO PRESERVE ELECTION RESULTS INDEFINITELY THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL BY AMENDING TITLE V, SUBTITLE A, SECTION 110, SUBSECTION I OF THE CODE.

The Deputy Attorney General of Elections shall be responsible for keeping all ballots and tallies for the five (5) day period of right to contest for that purpose.

TO READ:

The Deputy Attorney General of Elections shall be responsible for keeping all ballots and tallies, **in a location at his or her discretion, indefinitely.**

WHEREAS, election results are currently unavailable after 5 days;

WHEREAS, saving election results is prudent and preserves vital pieces of Associated Student Body and University of Mississippi history; AND

WHEREAS, preserved election results will be used to further the mission of the Department of Justice and will lead to more comprehensive election reform;

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED THAT THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY SENATE AMEND THE CODE TITLE V, SUBTITLE A, SECTION 110, SUBSECTION I.
